ASKING THE COURTS FOR MY KIDS BACK PARENT PEER SUPPORT PROJECT





If you have made changes or if the Department thinks the children might be better off at home, you or the Department can apply to the Children's Court to have the children returned to your care. This is called a Section 90 application.

Speak to a lawyer or contact Legal Aid if you want to find out how to make a Section 90 application to the Court and what you will need to do this.

Things that the Court will consider include:

- The changes you have made to be a better parent
- Whether the issues that brought the kids into care, have improved
- How old the child is and how long they have been in care
- Your child's wishes
- Your child's relationship with you and other important people
- Your ability to look after your child
- The impact that moving micht have on the child
